THE FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE

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Florida College has unique ways to support first year students, from Orientation to finding their God-given strengths through the Clifton Strengths Assessment. These initiatives are designed to ensure your student feels confident, supported, and ready to thrive academically, socially, and spiritually while they work toward their ultimate goal of completing a bachelor's degree.

ORIENTATION: YOUR STUDENT'S JOURNEY BEGINS

Orientation is a one and half day, required introduction to life at Florida College. It provides a glimpse into the experience that will define the next four years:

- Begin the day with praise alongside new classmates.
- Tour our state-of-the-art library, media lab, and residence halls.
- Learn about student organizations and peer support services.

As part of their first week, your student will also attend a Hospitality Night, where they'll be invited into a faculty or staff member's home, fostering community and connection.

FOUNDATIONS FOR A BIBLICAL WORLDVIEW

Incoming students are encouraged to take Foundations for a Biblical Worldview, a Bible course designed to ground them in understanding God, humanity, and morality. This course provides a strong biblical foundation and practical applications, influencing their studies and campus life while helping them grow in faith and service to God and others.

STAYING INFORMED

Your student will receive a weekly email, the Falcon Beat, from the Dean of Students every Sunday evening, keeping them informed about campus events and opportunities. Additionally, daily announcements during chapel (held Monday through Friday at 10:15 a.m.) ensure students stay up-to-date on all campus happenings.

ONGOING SUPPORT

The transition to college life can present challenges, but Florida College offers an array of resources to help students navigate their new environment. From peer mentors and academic advisors to the guidance of faculty and staff, your student will find support at every turn.

At Florida College, your student's academic journey is about more than preparing for a successful career—it's about building a foundation of faith and wisdom. Professors integrate Christian principles into every subject, guiding students to connect their faith to their field of study and all aspects of life. Whether pursuing a career in nursing, business, or education, your student will grow academically and spiritually, as we believe, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom" (Proverbs 9:10).

GUIDANCE AND ADVISING

Florida College's shared advising model ensures that students receive personalized guidance every step of the way:

Florida College uses the Clifton Strengths Assessment to help students identify and develop their natural talents, starting before they arrive on campus. Integrated throughout all four years, this approach supports academic success, personal growth, and improves student retention.

-**Academic Advisors:** Students begin their journey with advisors specializing in their area of interest, focusing on prerequisites and foundational courses.

-**Faculty Advisors:** Once students enter their upper division coursework, they transition to the faculty chair of their program, gaining expert mentorship for their specific field.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

At Florida College, we provide a variety of resources to help students achieve their academic goals:

-**The Academic Advising Center:** This resource equips students with tools for success, offering services like planning for graduate school or careers.

-**Knack Tutoring:** Florida College partners with Knack to offer on-demand peer tutoring for every course, providing flexible, year-round academic support. Trained and paid student tutors gain valuable experience while the college continuously monitors and improves the system.

-**Academic Labs:** One-on-one support in writing, communication, and math, with opportunities for extra credit from many professors.

GRADES AND SCHEDULING

Students can view their grades through Canvas and meet with advisors to schedule their classes. Florida College's hands-on advising model ensures every student has the support they need to plan their academic journey.

- College Hall** and **Jennifer Hall** accommodate sophomore and upper-division girls.

- On-Call Nurse:** A registered nurse is available to assist students with medical concerns. Students can contact the nurse through the Student Portal.
- Hurricane/Tropical Storm Safety:** Student safety is paramount during severe weather. Florida College actively monitors storm conditions and follows a detailed Hurricane/Tropical Storm Preparations Plan. Updates are sent through email, text, myFC, and the FC website.
